2. What is the UK washed by? *By the Atlantic Ocean, the North Sea, the Irish Sea, the English Channel and the Strait –of–Dover.*
3. What does the climate of the UK depend on? *It depends on the Gulf Stream which is a warm oceanic current.*
4. What is the difference between the UK and Great Britain? *The United Kingdom consists of England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland. Great Britain consists of only England, Scotland and Wales.*

5. What is the population of the UK? *The population of the UK is about 60 mln.*
6. What does the Union Flag stand for? How is it often called? *The flag of Britain embodies the emblems of three countries under one Sovereign. The emblems that appear on the Union Flag are the crosses of three patron saints:*
- ◆ *the red cross of St. George, for England, on a white ground;*
 - ◆ *the white diagonal cross, of St. Andrew, for Scotland, on a blue ground;*
 - ◆ *the red diagonal cross of St. Patrick, for Ireland, on a white ground.*
- It is often called Union Jack.*
